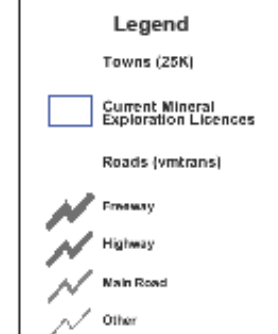
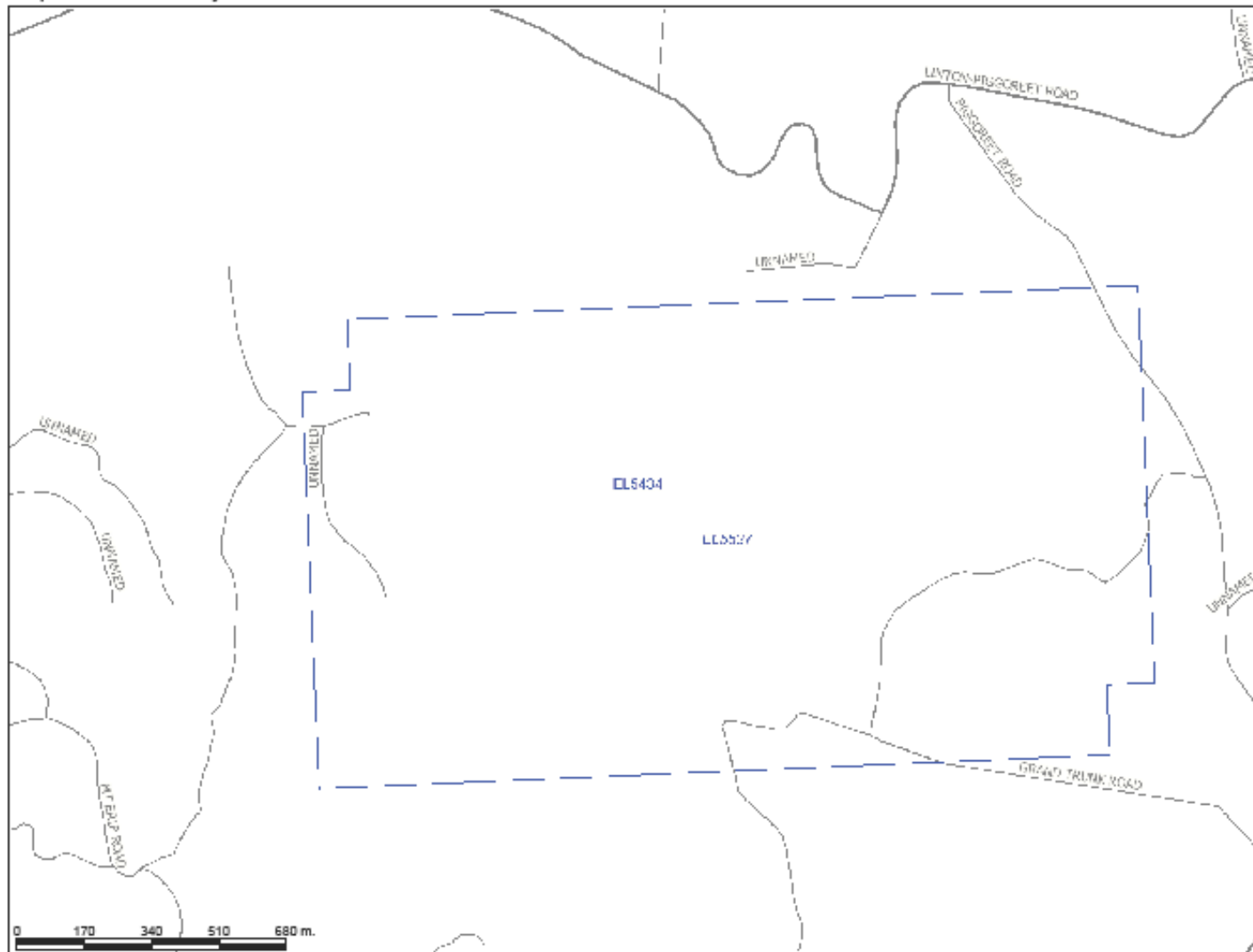
6. Other Statutory Requirements
